Recipe for October - Devon Apple Cake

Legend has it that the Devonshire Apple Cake was a symbol of comfort and togetherness among 19th-century farmers in Devonshire. After a long day in the fields, the scent of spiced apples would fill the air of the humble but cosy cottages—a heart-warming treat that was more than just a dessert. This old-fashioned Devonshire Apple Cake recipe has been passed down through generations, reminding us of simpler times

and the sweet joys of an unmaterialistic life

Ingredients: 450g cooking apples 350g SR flour 350g caster sugar 2 level tsps. baking powder juice of ½ lemon 4 large eggs 225g melted butter 1 tsp almond essence handful flaked or chopped almonds



Method: 1 Preheat the oven to 180°c /Fan 160°/Gas 4. Grease a 30 x 23cm (12 x 9) baking "tin and tine it with greaseproof paper 2 Peel, core and thinly slice the apples and squeeze the lemon juice over them. 3 Measure the flour sugar and baking powder into a large mixing bowl. 4 Beat the eggs together with the almond and stir into the flour mix together with the melted butter. 5 Whisk, then spread half of this mixture into the tin and arrange the apples evenly over the top of the cake mixture. Carefully top with the rest of the mixture, don't worry if some of the apples are poking through. Sprinkle with the almonds. 6 Bake in the oven for about 1 hour or until the cake is golden, firm to the touch and has slightly shrunk away from the sides. Lay a piece of foil over the top if it is browning too quickly and turn the fan oven down to 150° for the last 15 minutes. 7 Leave to cool for 15 minutes and then turn out and remove from the paper. sprinkle over with a little sugar and serve with cream, ice cream or fromage frais. Extra taste you can add 1 tsp ground cinnamon – Adds a warm, spicy flavour that complements the apples. 1 tsp vanilla extract – Enhances the cake's sweetness and flavour. This is a great way to use your apples up as we have had a bumper

crop this year in the village, enjoy baking



GARDENING TIPS FOR OCTOBER

- Rake up fallen leaves, pile them up to make leaf mould
- Burn or bin debris that show signs of fungal infection
- Dig over empty areas of soil
- Finish planting evergreen shrubs
- Take hardwood cuttings from shrubs and fruit bushes
- Collect berries from trees and shrubs for seed sowing
- Give conifer hedges a last trim if needed
- Plant new climbers and perennials
- Divide overgrown perennials
- Protect Alpines from winter wet
- Lift and store Dahlias, Gladioli and summer flowering bulbs
- Plant Lily and Tulip bulbs
- Tidy ponds and remove pumps for winter
- Make new lawns from Turf
- Lift and divide Rhubarb
- Insulate the greenhouse, and check heaters are in good working order
- Harvest Apples and Pears before they are damaged
- Lift potatoes and carrots and store them
- · Finish planting Spring bedding
- Make early sowing of Broad beans for next year
- Sow Sweet peas under cover for next year
- Sow grass seed
- Cut down the dying tops of perennial vegetables
- Lift and store tender perennials
- Prepare the ground for planting bare-rooted stock next month
